DESCRIPTION OF THE SCHOOL

Mission Bay High School (MBHS) is a comprehensive, public high school for grades 9-12 located in San Diego, CA. The community of Pacific Beach provides leadership for one middle school and four elementary schools.

MBHS supports approximately 1170 students from all over San Diego, including the local community and from the Program Involvement School Choice Program (PISC).

MBHS has a positive, well-ordered climate conducive to teaching and learning. Mission Bay High has a Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) accreditation.

MBHS offers a rigorous, coherent, and relevant curriculum including 23 International Baccalaureate, 7 Advanced Placement, 10 Honors, and 3 college courses taught on campus. The school provides programs to address special needs in GATE, English Language Development, and Special Education which includes the STARS program.

Each year approximately 32 percent of graduating seniors enter universities or colleges, with a significant number of students attending the University of California and California State University systems.

FACULTY

63 certificated staff members: 56 teachers, 4 counselors, 1 librarian, 1 nurse, and 3 administrators. Approximately 45 teachers hold a master's degree or higher.

GRADING SYSTEM AND RANKING POLICY

A four-point scale is used. Honors-designated courses with an "HP" (i.e. AP, IB, honors, college) are given an additional point in the weighted GPA. All semester grades earned in our district, after promotion from the eighth grade, are counted. The graduation GPA is computed based on grades 9-12. College courses are worth two credits each semester.

SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Mission Bay High School's school year was divided into two semesters, approximately eighteen weeks in length. Each day is divided into four 89-minute periods. Classes met every other day of the week, Monday through Friday. Distance Learning Update: 2020-21 is on a quarter system with 115 minute class periods on alternating days.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) PROGRAM

Mission Bay High School offers 23 IB courses this year to all upperclassmen. Enrollment is open to interested students and testing is encouraged. Students in our most rigorous program are considered "IB Diploma Candidates." They take six or seven IB courses in different subject areas between 11th and 12th grade. Additionally, they must design and engage in Creativity Action and Service Projects (150+ hours) and complete a 4,000 word Extended Essay (research paper) outside of class. In 2020, 255 students took 638 IB exams. 78% earned scores of 4 or better.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Mission Bay High School offered 7 Advanced Placement courses last year. Testing is optional. In 2020, 133 students took 184 AP exams. 68% earned scores of 3 or better.
